Dear Friends,

According to Mishlei 22:6, we are taught to educate "a child according to his or her needs so that when they are old, they will not depart from their path."

At B'nai Torah Congregation, our children's Jewish education remains at the forefront of our mission, and synagogue leadership sees this as a sacred responsibility.

Our Mirochnick Religious School creates innovative educational programming in an observant Conservative Jewish learning community, with an overarching purpose of conveying the joy and richness of Jewish life. Through experiential learning, students are provided with an opportunity to learn in a supportive environment where they and their families can successfully make connections between tefillah (prayer), song, mitzvot and midot (values); incorporating them into their daily lives which we hope will carry over into a lifelong pursuit of Jewish learning.

The Mirochnick Religious School strives to provide the highest quality education that equips our youth to serve as engaged citizens of the Jewish community, as well as the larger world around them. By engaging students in Grades K-12 in Jewish learning, teachers and staff contribute to the social and emotional character development and positive self-esteem of students.

Five years ago, as educational "goal posts" were changing, the Mirochnick Religious School changed to meet the evolving needs of our students and families and as a result provided a unique flex time schedule and program. Today, the "goal posts" continue to change and with the support of synagogue leadership, the Mirochnick Religious School pivoted to a virtual school offering classes and programming through the Spring and Summer. In September, when school opened for the new year, the program expanded and we now offer weekday Hebrew education, Shabbat school, religious school on Sunday morning, monthly classes for our high school students and programming for our highly subscribed Mishpacha (family) track.

While we strive to offer our students the best education possible, we need the resources to keep offering the highest quality opportunities for our children. B'nai Torah prioritizes focus on our next generation and invests heavily to meet this goal. Historically, tuition received from families does not cover the operating expenses of our program. With many families impacted economically by Covid-19, the need is even greater. We are blessed with the financial commitment of supporters that have already stepped forward. And we are now asking for your help to close the gap so that we can fulfill our promise to the next generation of learners, *Dor L'dor*. Here at B'nai Torah, we believe that Kindergarten creates the foundation for our children's Jewish lives. The award-winning Kindergarten program at Mirochnick religious school provides a nurturing environment for all of our students, where they learn Jewish values, social responsibility and that kindness matters. B'nai Torah makes available to families of our Ruth and Edward Taubman Early Childhood Center graduates free tuition for kindergarten to any B'nai Torah family as part of their membership. Your gift can make a real difference. As these students transition out of our Early Childhood program, offering Free Kindergarten at Mirochnick Religious School encourages future engagement of these families making it much easier for them to be part of our B'nai Torah community.

Annual Cost: \$750/student; 20 students for \$15,000



What's More Fun Than a Purim Carnival? A B'nai Torah Purim Carnival!

Join the joyful, zany celebration of the ancient holiday of Purim. At B'nai Torah Congregation, we do Purim right. Every year our religious schoolteachers staff all the booths and carnival rides for our families. From Face Painting to jumping in the bounce houses, there are prizes for winners of the different game booths, and great food booths where food can be purchased. As our funder, every year you will be invited to come eat an ice cream pop, play a game, meet the people behind the scenes who make it all possible...what a lovely way to spend a Sunday at our Purim Carnival.

Annual Cost: \$15,000



Madrichim: Teaching and Modeling Leadership to Those Who Come Next.

B'nai Torah High School students, dedicated and committed to sharing their skills and knowledge to others, make up our Madrichim group. These future leaders of the community are dedicated to passing on all the valuable insights and things they have learned to our younger students. This program offers post-B'nai Mitzvah teens the opportunity to develop communication and leadership skills, increase self-confidence, express Jewish values, and learn practical teaching skills while also staying engaged at B'nai Torah. Madrichim are able to earn community service hours or get compensated at an hourly rate.

Annual Cost: \$10,000



Shabbat is Here, Shabbat is Here, We're so Glad that Shabbat is Here, Candles Burning Bright - Shabbat Shalom

A family musical Shabbat service led by a song leader which will meet once a month on Shabbat Alternating Shabbat mornings and Friday evenings. A Shabbat service that will get you on your feet and in the Shabbat spirit. Friday night services will be followed by a dinner and Shabbat morning services will be followed by kiddush lunch. There will be separate programming for the children created and led by youth advisors after the meal. This will give parents the opportunity to socialize with one another which builds community.

Annual Cost: \$10,000



Free 8th Grade/Kadima Membership: Building Leaders From the Ground Up

Research shows that the drop off for religious affiliation often coincides with the Bar or Bat Mitzvah experience. At B'nai Torah's Hebrew High School, students extend and enhance their Jewish education. They also have time with their friends in our Kadima program that helps build strong future Jewish leaders connected to our Synagogue and the community at large.

Annual Cost: \$350/student

Mishpacha Track: Families That Learn Together Create Lifetime Memories

Families attend classes together and then have separate sessions with the Rabbi and the Educator designed especially for both Parents and their students.

Annual Cost: \$3,600



Shabbat Shalom: TGIS a special time for Families to Be Together

Harriet Glazer Hebrew Beit Midrash

Our Hebrew program is a model for differentiated learning. Differentiated learning is defined as "the right of each pupil to be taught in a way specifically tailored to his or her individual learning needs." Students of all grades share a large space where they are assigned to a teacher and work in small group settings. The groups work side-by-side and teachers are able to collaborate during sessions, which makes for a more proficient and effective learning experience. Students work on their Hebrew reading skills as indicated by their portfolios, and rotate from group sessions to learning centers as the class progresses.

Together they attend a dinner and participate in a Yom HaShoah service where they escort them for the procession. To see the profound effect on our young people when interacting with our brave survivors is very powerful. Flowers decorate the dinner tables, adding to the feeling of the evening being important, special and necessary. A printed pamphlet is created and distributed for the service.
